Police Department News

Police Department and McDonald's Host Coffee With A Cop Event:

On Saturday July 21, the Police Department partnered with McDonald's to hold a Coffee with a Cop event. The event provided an opportunity for Police Officers and community members to interact in an informal setting. Officers engaged the public by delivering meals to tables and having discussions about community issues. There were also several requests for Officers to take photos with customers and employees as these types of interactions with police are highly popular on social media. This Coffee with a Cop event is part of several planned community outreach events being presented by the Police Department. Our next event will be "Check-Out with a Cop" at the Walmart Neighborhood market on August 25, at 10:00 a.m. Officers will be on hand to interact with customers, listen to concerns and provide information about community issues.



Five People Arrested During Busy Sunday Nightshift: On Sunday July 22, the Police Department experienced a busy shift resulting in the arrest of five subjects on various charges. Early in the shift, an Officer stopped a subject on a bicycle for a traffic violation which resulted in the subject being arrested on an outstanding narcotics related warrant. A short time later, Officers responded to a family dispute in the 4600 block of Windsong Lane. A male subject at the location was arrested for being in violation of a restraining order. Later in the evening, Officers responded to the 5400 block of Orangethorpe regarding a traffic collision involving a single vehicle. Upon arrival, Officers discovered the driver had left the scene of the collision on foot. Officers located the subject, who showed signs of intoxication. The driver was arrested and booked for Driving Under the Influence and Leaving the Scene of a Collision. A short time later, Officers responded to the parking lot of the La Quinta Inn regarding a couple involved in an argument. The Officers arrived at which time they were immediately confronted by a hostile male subject. The subject had to be physically restrained in handcuffs due to being uncooperative with the Officers at the scene. He was arrested and booked for Disorderly Conduct and Public Intoxication. Finally, at about 1:00 a.m., Officers responded to an apartment in the 5600 block of Orangethorpe Avenue regarding a Domestic Violence incident. Officers learned that a male subject had struck his girlfriend in the face knocking her front teeth loose and causing other injuries. The subject then fled the area on foot prior to their arrival. Officers search the area and located the subject near-by and placed him under arrest for Domestic Violence. He was booked and later transported to Orange County Jail. The victim was treated for her injuries and released.
